As part of its visionary **Alumni Interaction Series**, SRM College of Nursing, Kattankulathur, organized a compelling and transformative alumni guest lecture on **7th May 2024** under the thought-provoking theme, "Where a World of Opportunities Awaits." This event was carefully curated to provide nursing students with meaningful exposure to global career pathways, licensure processes, and firsthand insights into international clinical practice. The program was conducted in **offline mode** at the **Ground Floor Seminar Hall of SRM General Hospital (SRMGH)**, offering students the opportunity to engage directly with the guest speaker in a face-to-face setting—an invaluable format for personalized learning and mentorship.

The session featured Ms. Nisha Yadav Jagdish, a distinguished alumna of SRM College of Nursing, who completed her B.Sc Nursing degree in 2018. Currently practicing as a Travel and Emergency Room Nurse in Northern Ontario, Canada, Ms. Nisha has built a dynamic and successful career in the Canadian healthcare system. Her unique professional journey from a student at SRM to a registered nurse in a foreign healthcare environment made her an ideal speaker for the session. She brought a wealth of knowledge, real-world experiences, and practical advice, serving as a role model and mentor to the students in attendance.

The event commenced promptly at 2:00 PM with an official welcome by Ms. Aswathy Nair, Tutor, SRM College of Nursing and the event coordinator. She introduced the guest speaker and emphasized the significance of such alumni interactions in bridging academic education with professional realities. The session drew participation from 84 B.Sc Nursing students from the III Year and IV Semester, along with 12 DGNM II Year students, bringing the total attendance to 96 students. These students, currently in critical phases of their academic journey, were enthusiastic about gaining exposure to international career opportunities and learning about the challenges and rewards that come with working abroad.

Ms. Nisha Yadav began her presentation by sharing her personal and professional journey, detailing how she navigated the transition from nursing education in India to securing licensure and employment in Canada. She offered a comprehensive overview of the steps required to pursue a nursing career internationally, focusing on critical elements such as credential evaluation, preparing for language proficiency tests like IELTS, and clearing the **National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN)**. She also explained the process of registering with Canadian nursing boards and adapting to documentation and interview standards abroad.

In addition to the procedural aspects, Ms. Nisha gave deep insights into the **cultural and professional expectations in Canadian healthcare settings**, especially within high-pressure units like emergency care. She spoke about her experiences working as a travel nurse, highlighting the flexibility, scope of practice, and critical thinking skills required in diverse hospital environments. Her discussion included key areas such as patient-centered care, cross-cultural communication, ethical dilemmas, and the importance of continuing education and specialization in building a sustainable nursing career overseas.

The presentation was interactive, empowering students to ask questions and seek guidance on specific topics including job search strategies, differences between Indian and foreign nursing systems, and the emotional preparedness needed for relocating abroad. Ms. Nisha's approachable demeanor, coupled with her honest reflections, helped students visualize their own potential pathways and inspired confidence among those considering global career options.

Feedback from the participants was overwhelmingly positive. Students described the session as "inspiring, informative, and extremely relevant to their professional goals." Many were particularly impressed with the speaker's clarity in explaining complex procedures and her willingness to offer personalized advice. The session helped demystify international licensure processes and provided students with a practical, step-by-step understanding of how to plan and prepare for careers in countries like Canada. Several students noted that hearing directly from an alumna gave the information a sense of credibility and relatability that formal career talks often lack.

The program concluded at **3:00 PM** with a heartfelt **vote of thanks delivered by Mrs. V. Priya**, M.Sc (N), Assistant Professor, SRM College of Nursing. She expressed deep gratitude to Ms. Nisha Yadav for taking time out of her professional commitments to return to her alma mater and share her journey. Mrs. Priya highlighted how alumni involvement not only supports current students academically and professionally but also strengthens the institution's legacy of excellence and community. She also acknowledged the efforts of the event coordinator and faculty members for organizing a program that was both impactful and inspiring.
