## The challenges of a Wireless Sensor Network

With limitless applications and a surge in research in the field of “Wireless Sensor Networks”, the Department of ECE (Electronics and Communication Engineering) recently organized a Short Term Training Program on “Recent Research Issues in Wireless Sensor Networks”. Dr. Narayana Rao, Director (Research) inaugurated the event, sponsored by the Indian Society for Technical Education (ISTE). About 30 teaching faculties Tamil Nadu, Nagpur and Andhra Pradesh participated. Dr. Guna Sundari of Pondicherry Engineering College gave an overview of “Wireless Sensor Networks and its research challenges” on the first day which was followed by talks on “Industrial Trends on WSN” and “Low Power Radio Sensor Network” from the Industrial sector. The second and third day also saw many celebrated speakers from MIT, Chennai, SSN

college of Engineering, Velammal College, Gill Instruments and SRM University. The topics covered included Object Detection and tracking in WSN, Power Optimization in WSN and Compressive Sensing in WSN. Mr. Gurjit Singh of Gill Instruments also gave hands-on training in “MSP 430 based sensor board programming”. The participants showed their enthusiasm towards learning the research trends and were illuminated by a practical session on “Introduction to network simulator software Qualnet and Intensive training on Wireless Sensor Network library” on the 4th day by Mr. Anand Kumar of Nihon Communication Solutions.

Dr. Narayana Rao and Dr. S Malarvizhi, HOD (ECE) also said that there should be more research in this field and showed interest in coming up with solutions for problems like Forest Fire Notification and many others.

## BIO-ETHICS in Medicine

National Conclave & Seminar on Bioethics in Medicine was held recently. The theme of the Conclave was ‘Developing a Bioethics curriculum for Medical Education’. The components of the conclave were a retreat for discussions on bioethics curriculum; Seminar and a Consultative meeting of the Indian chairs and invitees.

The field of medicine has made rapid advances recently. As a result, newer ethical issues, are also emerging. Bioethics (medical ethics) deals with the study of such issues and finds

effective solutions. However, in the current medical curriculum, this field does not find its deserved place. Hence, when the students start their medical practice, they feel inadequate. Conscious of this lacuna, several initiatives had been taken, around the world. The division of Ethics of Science and Technology of UNESCO has published a Bioethics Core Curriculum in 2008. The International Chair on Bioethics has formed a wide international network on Bioethics, and has taken the lead. The Case books and Ethical commentaries, published by the UNESCO International Chair on Bioethics, serve as

very good resources.

India has the largest number of medical schools in the world. The Medical Council of India in the Vision 2015 Document calls for introducing ethics in the medical curriculum, at the undergraduate and the postgraduate levels. Thus, there is an urgent need for developing an appropriate curriculum. Several enlightened medical academia, in India, have designed and tested various courses of varying durations. At the field level, two issues hamper effective and universal implementation of a bioethics curriculum. The undergraduate medical student

is already burdened with a voluminous study load and the time available during the undergraduate course is very short. This issue is compounded by the non-availability of teachers, who are trained in bioethics. These two vexatious issues are sought to be solved by a novel model.

In this novel model designed at the India Nodal Bioethics Centre, the Core bioethics curriculum of UNESCO 2008, forms the main stay. The modular design and lesson plan integrate vertically into the existing general medical curriculum. The USP of this model is that it is comprehensive and requires minimal additional time and less number of exclusive bioethics teachers. This unique design, is christened as ‘Vertically

Integrated Teaching of Bioethics to the Undergraduate Medical students (acronym: vitum-bioethics).

The development of this model is a continuous process. Consultations are under way with several chairs, in India and abroad. This demanding task requires the effort and skill of all concerned. Besides the conventional bioethics principles enshrined in the western philosophies, cultural issues relevant in the local milieu need to be incorporated in the curriculum.

The conclave at SRM University, was a concrete step. This conclave represented India and Sikkim. Additionally, the national unit of Nepal was represented.

## Swarm Intelligence Algorithms

The Dept. of EEE and IEEE computational Intelligence society jointly arranged the IEEE distinguished lecture programme at Dr.T.P.Ganesan Auditorium Mini Hall 2. Dr.K.Vijayakumar, Professor and Head, Dept of EEE, welcomed the august gathering. Dr.N.Kumarappan, Chair, IEEE CIS, Madras chapter, gave a detailed report about the activities of CIS and introduced the chief guest to the audience. The chief guest Dr. Yaochu Jin, Professor of computational Intelligence, Department of Computing, University of Surrey, Guildford, UK, gave a talk on the topic "Swarm Intelligence based on competition and social learning for scalable optimization".

The talk was about two recently developed swarm intelligence algorithms for scalable optimization, one based

on competition mechanism and other on the social learning mechanisms. Both the competition and social learning mechanisms are embedded into a framework of particle swarm optimization. In competition based swarm optimization algorithm, a pair wise competition mechanism is introduced, where particle that loses a competition will update its position by learning from the winner. In social learning based PSO, individuals learn from any better particles in the current swarm. Both algorithms have been shown to be very competitive with state-of-the-art swarm algorithms for the optimization of medium to large scale optimization problems.

The Programme came to an end with vote of thanks by Dr.S.S.Dash. About 150 participants from various institutions and universities attended the programme and were benefited.

# Impart acquired knowledge to paramedical staff, SRM Chairman tells Cardiologists

Doctors with specialised skills in interventional cardiology play an important part in saving lives especially at critical times but this knowledge has to be passed on to paramedical staff like Cath-Lab technologists, Cath Lab staff nurses and nurses at the intensive cardiac care, Mr. Ravi Pachamoothoo, Chairman of SRM Group of Institutions told leading cardiologists from India and the United States.

Delivering the keynote address to the Third Annual Conference of the Tamil Nadu Interventional Council, Mr. Ravi said "... doctors who have acquired specialized skills in interventional cardiology play an important role in treating heart attacks (Myocardial Infarction) and saving lives in the golden hour. But imparting the required knowledge to paramedical staff like Cath-Lab Technologists, Cath-Lab staff nurses and Intensive Cardiac Care staff nurses is of paramount importance. This will help the staff to take care of the patients, professionally as well as efficiently, till they are discharged from the hospital".

For a person who has established medical colleges, specialist hospitals and state of the art Cath Labs in all these institutions the Chairman of the SRM Group called on the Tamil Nadu Interventional Council—a sub-speciality council of the Cardiological Society of India, Chennai Chapter—to take the initiative and conduct training programmes and workshops for the paramedical personnel so as to provide "total care

for cardiac patients".

More than 350 leading cardiologists and related experts in the field from Tamil Nadu, India and the United States attended the two day meeting in Chennai—an event that included not only lectures by prominent personalities on advances in cardiology and interventional medicine but also workshops and hands-on operative procedures. Prominent cardiologists who put together the conference included Dr. S. Elangovan, Professor and Head of the Cardiology Department at SRM University Medical College and Research Centre and President of the Cardiological Society of India together with Dr. Sengottuvelu, Senior Consultant Cardiologist at Apollo Hospitals.

Representing SRM Group of Institutions were the Cardiology and Cardiothoracic Departments of SRM Medical College Hospital and Research and Research Centre at Kattankulathur and the SRM Institutes of Medical Science (SIMS), a super speciality hospital at Vadapalani headed by Drs Elangovan and Harshavardhan and Drs Subramanian and Raghuram respectively.

For the first time there was a Live Case Workshop which was telecast from SRM Medical College Kattankulathur that featured two interesting but complicated cases—a 60 year old male with complex coronary artery disease (Chronic total Occlusion) where angioplasty and stenting were done using a "tapered stent", the first time such a stent is being used in India; and a 12 year old girl with a hole in the ventricular septum (ventricular septal defect) which

was rectified without surgery by the use of an intra-ventricular device. Both patients were discharged from hospital after three days and are doing well.

"If we are to go by current projections India will have the largest cardio-vascular disease burden in the world with one fifth of the deaths in India coming from coronary heart diseases. By 2020 it is believed that in India coronary heart diseases will account for nearly one-third

of deaths with more and more younger people of the country succumbing to this disease. It is certainly not a nice feeling to know that even while India grows rapidly economically and achieves a high level of technological advancement, hundreds of thousands of young Indians are not going to be alive to see all this" the Chairman of the SRM said in his prepared remarks.
