- 6. Participants are requested to maintain decorum and conduct
- 7. The competition will take place during the lunch hour, so kindly plan accordingly

TRADITIONAL ATTIRE CONTEST

- 1. Participation Individual competition
- 2. Perform an attire fashion show
- 3. Showing signs only related to the festive allowed
- 4. The duration of the competition will be 40 minutes
- 5. Participants are requested to maintain decorum and conduct
- 6. The competition will take place during the lunch hour, so kindly plan accordingly

DAY 2 (10TH JANUARY 2024)

CLAY POT PAINTING
