SRM Institute of Science and Technology awarded highest grade of A++ by NAAC

SRM Institute of Science and Technology, (formerly SRM University) has been recently accredited with the highest grade A++ (A double plus) by NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council). It is another feather to SRM's cap as it prides over being awarded the highest ranking given to institutions. In the new accreditation process, about 70% weightage is assigned to quantitative metrics. The institution is called upon to upload the evidence which is subsequently verified by using computer based tools. SRMIST with 50000 plus students and 3200+ faculty members offers programs in the disciplines of Engineering, Medicine, Science, Humanities, Management, Law, Health Sciences, Dentistry, Hotel Management, Agricultural Sciences and Teacher Education and certainly is one of the largestmulti-disciplinary universities in India to be assessed by the new methodology and accredited with the highest honors.

SRMIST's score of 3.55 on a 4.00 scale, makes it automatically eligible to be granted graded autonomy as Category I university as per the University Grants Commission [Categorization Of Universities (Only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy] Regulations, 2018. On becoming a Category I University, SRMIST shall be

On becoming a Category I University. SRMIST shall be automatically deemed to be under section 12B of the **University Grants** Commission Act, 1956; it can also start off-campuses and increase internationalization

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In October 2017, QS (Quacquarelli Symonds Ltd), UK based world renowned ranking agency has also rated SRMIST as a "4 Star" institute with "5 Star" ratings in specific categories of Teaching, Employability and Inclusiveness.

In addition to the highest grade achieved by SRMIST in NAAC

accreditation, which is institution based, it has international program based accreditations also to its credit. Five of its engineering programs offered at Kattankulathur campus have been accredited by commissions of ABET, USA (www.abet.org) and four by UK based IET (The Institution of Engineering and Technology). Such international accreditations have resulted in close to 800 students from 64 countries studying at SRMIST.

Accreditation by NAAC with the highest grade is the culmination of many innovative measures benefitting the students and faculty alike resulting in an invigorating learning atmosphere. Adoption of IDEAL (Inter-Disciplinary Experiential Active Learning) curriculum with option to go for specialization at undergraduate level itself, implementation of FIIP (Faculty Industry Immersion programme), scheduled interaction sessions with students by top management and performance linked incentive schemes for faculty are but a few of the measures which have instilled a sense of purpose among the teachers and the

Aside from the fact that all our professional programs are AICTE approved, rating agencies have had high praise for the Student Abroad Program, entrepreneurship as a project, alumni and student representatives in Board of Studies and Academic Council. 

Thai Cave Rescue: A Tale of Heroes

It all started with a birthday.

On 23rd June, Peerapat 'Night' Sompiangiai turned seventeen and decided to celebrate the occasion with his friends, members of local youth football team, and their assistant coach, Ekkapol 'Ake' Chantawong. To Tham Luang, a serpentine network of caves that spans across 10 km beneath the mountain range that separates Thailand and Myanmar. The boys' plans to visit Tham Luang had been discussed on a messaging app, so when the group did not return home, their parents headed straight to the cave. They found the bikes, the bags, and some football shoes outside and raised the alarm.

It had been raining incessantly for the last few days and all the water had been draining into the cave system. The boys were pushed further backwards into the caves by a flash flood and eventually found themselves marooned on a small rocky

shelf about 4 km from the cave entrance. Outside the cave, a full-blown rescue operation had begun by the elite Thai Navy Seals, the national police and other rescue teams. The news of the crisis began to spread internationally on 28th June and very soon volunteers from all over the world reached out to them.

They were rescued by 10th July, alive and safe after over two weeks of efforts by the rescue operations team. This was a tale full of heroes; from the brave boys and their resilient coach who faced an adversity of an unprecedented magnitude to their parents back home who never lost hope. From the former Thai Navy Seal diver, Sam Gunan, who lost his life trying to save thirteen innocent lives to the thousands who volunteered to stand up for humanity. This is a tale that deserves to be sung over and over again till the valour and magnanimity of it are indelibly inked on the walls of time.

Life on Mars?

Finding life on any planet, but Earth has somehow seemed a far-fetched dream to many people all over the world. But, all thanks to the recent developments in technology and research, not only it has become possible to reach Mars, but also to set up

some kind of settlement in the not-so-distant future.

Former astronaut Chris Hadfield, one of the more prominent faces among space travellers, recently gave the scientific community a bit of a shock by claiming that NASA probably could have landed astronauts on Mars as far back as the 1960s if they really wanted to. His claim was based on the

idea that the technology that made the journey from the Earth to the Moon possible, could also be applied for the journey from the Earth to Mars. However, he also believes that a majority of astronauts being sent to Mars wouldn't survive the journey. It would be a recipe for a disaster to try and keep astronauts alive and healthy on their journey to the planet.

Another huge factor that could affect the success of the expedition, would be that Mars is approximately 600 times farther than the moon. Adding to the trouble is the fact that the distance between the Earth and Mars keeps changing as the planets revolve around the Sun.

Hadfield believes that someone has to invent something that we haven't thought of yet because it isn't practical to send people to Mars due to the danger involved and the immensely long travel

The Youngest "Kilauea" Vapourised an Island to Sky!!

On May 3rd 2018, Thursday the "KILAUEA" volcano erupted dramatically when an earthquake of magnitude 5.0 struck 'the big Island' of Hawaii, USA. The lava from the eruption spread over the residential areas in the Puma district of the island and only a day after this event, another series of earthquakes of the highest recorded seismic magnitudes in the past 40 years struck the island. This led to new fissures that spewed magma as high as a three storey building.

The devastation continued by

the striking quakes of seismic magnitudes ranging between 3.9-4.9 during the course of the entire week. It was reported that over 2,000 people have been evacuated from the major active sites. People were airlifted to safety when they were trapped by lava on an isolated patch of land. The lava streamed across a highway and flowed in the ocean that sent hydrochloric acid and steam with fine particles into the air. It can lead to several cardiovascular problems for the people inhabiting the island. "We have no way of knowing whether this is really the beginning or toward the end of this eruption",

said Dr. Tom Shea, a volcanologist at the University of Hawaii commented. "Kilauea" is the youngest of all the five active volcanoes present on the island,

with an age of around 30,000 years. The last time when Kilauea erupted was back in 1964. The volcano has demolished most of the island and the rest of the

Hawaiian chain. However, the human race is one of the most adaptable species on this planet and will soon recover from this natural calamity.
