SRM Institute of Science and Technology, Kattankulathur – 603 203 has introduced the Choice Based Flexible Credit System (CBFCS) for Faculty of Engineering and Technology Programmes from 2015 batch onwards. Under 2015 Regulations, the students are given a Grade Card at the end of each semester, containing the following letter grades with the Credit points as indicated.

The Grading scale being followed for the students is as indicated below:

F – Failure due to insufficient Marks in the course, Ab – Failure due to Non-Appearance in the examination, I – Failure due to insufficient attendance in the course.

The SGPA (Grade Point Average) is given for each semester. Also the CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average) is given at the end of each semester taking into account the Grades and the Credits earned by the student in all the courses till that semester (From First Semester for UG).

The Final CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average) is given at the end of the programme taking into account the Grades and the credits earned by the student in all the courses for students from 2015 batch of Undergraduate Degree. The overall performance of the student is indicated by the CGPA on a 10 point scale.

The Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is calculated by considering all the courses taken from the first semester onwards for regular students and from third semester onwards for lateral entry students.

The CGPA earned by the student is indicative in nature. Since the marks secured by the student for each course is given in the transcript issued for the purpose of higher studies/employment, the percentage of marks scored by the student may also be considered. Since Marks are provided, there is no provision for conversion of CGPA to Percentage.

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
