# TO CONSIDER AND ADOPT MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY RESEARCH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 21.06.2018

Vice Chancellor in his introductory remarks expressed that in SRMIST, there is no council at the University level to look after research. Hence he renamed the existing Research Advisory Committee as University Research Council(URC). This council will have the following objectives.

- 1. To work with Faculty/Schools/departments to create the appropriate environment and associated infrastructure to enable the Institute's research and impact to be positioned at the forefront of national and international developments, both taking account of and shaping future agendas.
- 2. To suggest the priority areas of research in the Faculty/Schools/departments particularly with reference to the role and responsibility of the Institute taking into account the facilities available in the Institute and expertise of the faculty members. Further, the suggested trust areas to have great visibility and societal impact.

- 3. To promote collaboration and interdisciplinary research both internally and externally, nationally and internationally, in order to improve the quality of the Institute's research. The Research Advisory Committee could advise and help the faculty members to establish collaboration with national laboratories and premier institutions.
- 4. To advise on the development of strategic research partnerships with business and industry.
- 5. To oversee the development and delivery of appropriate staff development activities for researchers.
- To oversee local implementation of national research-related initiatives such as Smart Cities., Also, the RAC could suggest and guide in establishing Centers of Excellence (CoEs)
- 7. To advise on and monitor progress towards research grants received by the faculty members from the Government agencies, industries, etc.
- 8. To develop and review policies and practices to improve the quality, impact and quantity of research activity, monitor implementation and evaluate outcomes.
- To approve procedures for allocating research funds and monitor their implementation.

10. To formulate guidelines pertaining to the conduct of Ph.D. and Post-Doctoral research programs offered by SRMIST on the lines prescribed by the UGC.

The Board of Management ratified the minutes of UNIVERSITY RESEARCH COUNCIL.

#### 44 BOM E 1 IMPREST AMOUNT

At present there is no IMPREST AMOUNT at HOD level. It was discussed that the HODs might have an IMPREST AMOUNT of Rs. 10000 each to meet out any petty cash emergency academic expenditures arising in the department concerned .

Members expressed concern that granting imprest cash on a revolving basis without any CAP might lead to uncontrolled expenditure. Monitoring and accounting of each expenditures incurred by 100 plus HODs, 30 plus Deans and Directors would be difficult and laborious.

# 44 BOM E 2 De-Centralisation & Delegation of Financial

#### Powers:

It was resolved that the cash limits given below to the respective functionaries in SRMIST subject to approval by the Managing Trustee be implemented:

- Should not exceed the above limits fixed at any point of time.
- On a regular basis expenditure incurred along with supporting bills/ documents should be audited by Internal Audit Department.
- Only the above functionaries can approve expenditure and cannot delegate powers to others in the Department.
- Expenditure should not be incurred for items such as stationery, refreshment, food items, transport for which centralized arrangements are available in the Campus.
- Before requesting H.O. for replenishment of imprest cash all audited bills for expenditure incurred for previous withdrawal should be put up and got approved by the Registrar.
- All expenditures out of imprest cash should be accounted at the Registrar Office as at present.
- All expenses should be within the approved budget for the year.

- An Imprest cash of Rs. 10,000/- would be given to all HOD's for day to day functioning on revolving basis. However overall limit for the whole year should not exceed Rs. 50,000/-.
- HOD's would enjoy /undertake initiation of Purchase or related action1 of any value provided such items are already approved in the budget.

# 44 BOM E 3 IMPLEMENTATION OF GRATUITY SCHEME AS A STAFF WELFARE MEASURE:

Director (Finance) informed that the SRM Management has decided to implement gratuity scheme as a staff welfare measure. According to the Gratuity scheme, employees who are in service as on 01.06.2018 and who have completed a period of five years of continuous service shall become entitled for gratuity. The maximum limit of gratuity will be Rs. 20 lacs. The gratuity scheme will be operated based on a tie up with LIC.

# 44 BOM E 4 IMPLEMENTATION OF PENSION SCHEME AS A STAFF WELFARE MEASURE:

Director (Finance) also informed that implementation of pension scheme as a staff welfare measure is under consideration and the scheme will be implemented under joint contribution of employee and Management. The details are being worked out and will be intimated at the appropriate time.
