The new SRM University, Haryana located in 47.63 acres at Rajiv Gandhi Education City, Sonapat is the new venture that will provide technical education in Engineering, Management, and also in Commerce. The present infrastructure of SRM University Haryana is of one lakh square feet.

The Chancellor wished the students of the 1st Batch to avail of the best academic facilities and to come out with flying colours as the first ambassadors of this new university. The first batch of this university will be specially remembered in the history than any other batch. "The development of SRM University will be a continuous one with the oncoming medical college, a massive hospital block, multistoried engineering block, science and humanity blocks and a world class administrative block,"

the Founder Chancellor said.

The management has made every effort to provide the best possible facilities of a air conditioned class rooms, indoor and outdoor sports, separate hostel for boys and girls, and air conditioned buses. 25% of the seats will be reserved for the poor students of Haryana domicile. He said that SRM Education group has been in the field of education since 1959 & has been running 20 prestigious institutions in the field of medical sciences, engineering & technology and science, arts, science and management.

Mr. Ravi Pachamoothoo, Chairman of the SRM Group and Founder Chancellor of SRM University, Haryana, in his presidential address, focused on what made him develop this new university in Haryana near Delhi. "About 60% students of the SRM University Chennai are from North and North-Eastern states and many from North India could not get admission in SRM due to a large number of aspirants and hence his idea was to develop a world class university near Delhi and cater to the needs of students of the North and North - East India, he said,"

When he approached the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Haryana, Mr. Bhupender Singh Hooda, not only he was pleased to allot



Nearly 60 scholarships were given away here during the Fresher's induction of SRM Teacher Education and training school. Prior to him, Dr. Vinaitheerthan, director of SRM school of Teacher Education and Training, in his short welcoming speech advised the freshers to become "good teachers in Tamil Nadu".

Dr. Muthamizchelvan, also claimed that today's learning methodology is a "win-win" situation with the availability of other technological resources. He quoted the "three filters" used by Socrates and asked the freshers to use the same to imbibe only useful communications.

"Teachers blame students and students blame teachers, this is the current scenario", claimed the director of Engineering and Technology. He advised the freshers to keep themselves updated and have an open mind. This would, according to him, provide ground for debate and deliberation which would help in better interaction.

Make Students Think - Chancellor

Paying rich tributes to the teaching community of the SRM Group of Institutions, the Founder Chancellor Dr. T.R.Pachamuthu reminded faculty and senior administration members that in the highly competitive world of education reaching a certain level is only one part of the challenge but retaining the top position is of a higher order.

The Chancellor spoke on the occasion of Teacher's day, an event that saw more than four hundred faculty members in the SRM educational family honored for their academic and intellectual contributions by way of securing funding from outside agencies for projects, publications and research.

The Founder Chancellor also announced that from next year onward, SRM University will start naming "Teacher of the Year" in each of the faculties with a view to honoring those individuals who have contributed to the cause of education in the SRM family of institutions. The process of selection will be "open and transparent", the Chancellor said.

"You are all good and eminent teachers and it is with your support we are able to go around the world" The Chancellor remarked going on to recall his recent meeting

with the Chief Minister of Sikkim who asked him "Will you explain to me how is it that you are able to make SRM University a role model of a University in India?". The Chancellor told the teachers assembled at the Dr. T.P. Ganesan Auditorium, "It is you and your contribution that makes Chief Ministers and Governors speak of us".

The Chancellor noted with satisfaction the progress in different areas registered at the SRM Group of educational institutions but stressed that much more needed to be done. "It is a highly competitive world. A teacher should go beyond books. Can you make your students think?", the Chancellor posed. "People's expectations of a teacher are manifold... You should think of what extra that is in you that you can pass on to the student", the Chancellor maintained.

"SRM University is like a temple chariot... everyone should give their support and strength so that this chariot can go around the world" he said.

In his welcome address, the Director of Engineering and technology, Dr. C. Muthamizhselvan pointed to the steady growth in the publications of faculty members in the SRM Group—in 2012 the faculty publications amounted to 227

2012-13 it rose to 26 projects for nearly Rs 7 crores in sanctioned funding by agencies. Dr. Rao pointed out that for the first time SRM University students have secured a funding of Rs 72 lakhs from the Central Government for specialized work on "search

engines".

The programme also witnessed felicitations by the Advisor to the Chancellor, Dr. Manik Sahani, the Vice Chancellor, Dr. M. Ponnavaikko and the Pro Vice Chancellor for Planning and Development, Dr. T.P. Ganesan.

A day like Independence Day is a day to recollect and reflect on what it is the country has achieved over the years and in the kind of challenges ahead of us, said the Pro Vice Chancellor for Planning and Development of SRM University, Dr. T.P. Ganesan.

Dr. Ganesan was the Guest of Honor at the 67th Independence Day celebrations at the Kattankulathur campus. Upon arrival he inspected a guard of honor and later unfurled the national tricolor.

Dr. Ganesan pointed out that after Independence, India has indeed come a long way by way of advancements in socio-economic and scientific areas. The abolition of the zamindari system aside, India has witnessed the first Green Revolution, there has been good progress in science and technology as for instance

in aerospace and nuclear power projects. "Education has also improved and we have made strides in communication" Dr. Ganesan said.

Bio-informatics Student Bags the Prestigious Khorana Scholarship



For Ms. Adithie Maddaala from the Final year of B.Tech Bioinformatics, it was a dream come true when she won the Khorana Scholarship. The Khorana Scholars Program is a prestigious program that provides opportunities to Indian students to undertake research at the University of Wisconsin-Madison (UW), USA and partner universities in summer for a period of 10 weeks. The program honors Har Gobind Khorana, the Indian-born scientist whose research at the University of Wisconsin-Madison led to a Nobel Prize.

About 30 undergraduate students from the whole country are chosen based on their research interest and their CGPA ranking. She was selected to undertake a research program at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln in the Systems Biology Lab under Professor Chi Zhang. The lab is currently working on the identification of long non coding RNA, a type of non-coding RNA, from the RNA-seq data. She contributed to their project by developing a pipeline for the identification and analysis of differential expression of genes in Arabidopsis thaliana and Zea mays. Adithie says, "Life Science is a subject that had always fascinated me.

This is why I had no hesitation in opting for Bioinformatics in my B Tech degree as I consider this to be a very futuristic subject and a subject that has plenty of scope for research. The Khorana Scholarship has now provided me with a stepping stone to move on and succeed in the field of academia and research in the field of Bioinformatics."

This program started in the year 2007, and is a joint venture by The University of Wisconsin-Madison (UW), the Government of India (DBT), and Indo-US Science and Technology Forum (IUSSTF). The sponsors take care the airfare of the scholars and accommodation and provide a stipend of \$2000 for the 10 weeks.


The Director of Research Dr.D.Narayana Rao said that SRM University, realizes the need and importance of research and strongly encourages and supports endeavours in this field.

The centre has now become the Nodal Bioethics Centre for India. Many professors from India and abroad were appointed as Honorary professor of Bioethics. In February 2013, the SRM University Chair on Bioethics was established with Dr. P. Thangaraju (Pro Vice Chancellor, Medical)

as the Head of the bioethics unit and Dr. D. Balakrishnan (Dean, Medical Research) as the Chair of the same. In July 2013, SRM University was recognised as the Lead Chair of India. The Nodal Centre at SRM University will establish and coordinate national bioethics units at universities. The centre will also be involved
